LESLEY KOPLOW LECTURES ON CREATING SCHOOLS THAT HEAL: DEVELOPING EMOTIONALLY RESPONSIVE COMMUNITIES THAT "INVITE AND CONTAIN"

Noted author and highly acclaimed lecturer Lesley Koplow returns to St. Louis for a second year to present a series of talks to the community. Her research, lectures and books have helped educators construct therapeutic learning environments for all children, especially children who live amidst violence, neglect and family stress. Ms. Koplow will present an in-depth, cutting edge discussion at the Institute based on her experiences and research in New York City public schools following September 11, 2001, as well as with other crises that have affected children in individual schools and classrooms.
