Thomas J. Cohn to receive Quality of Life Award

Thomas Cohn is being recognized by the MDRT Foundation (Million Dollar Round Table) with a Quality of Life Award for his volunteer work with the Institute. In his honor, MDRT will award a grant to support the Institute, given at the annual meeting of the MDRT in June 26-29 in New Orleans, Louisiana. Award amounts will be disclosed at that time (the minimum possible is \$2,500). Tom has been an important part of the Institute for more than nine years. In 1995 when the Institute was planning a breakfast seminar for family-owned business executives, Tom and the Todd Organization joined the effort as sponsors of the program. In 1996, Tom became a member of the Institute's Board of Directors. Since then, Tom has acted as Chairman of the Planned Giving Committee (2001-present) and member of the Endowment Campaign Solicitation Team (2003-present).

Gerald Fogel, M.D., to speak at Hy Fingert Lecture

Gerald I. Fogel, M.D., is the guest speaker for the annual Hyman H. Fingert MD Memorial Lecture, to be held Friday, September 16. Dr. Fogel is clinical professor of psychiatry, Oregon Health Sciences University, Portland, Oregon; nationally recognized speaker and contributor to the psychoanalytic literature; founding faculty member of the Oregon Psychoanalytic Center; and training and supervising analyst for the American Psychoanalytic Association, appointed in 1983. Dr. Fogel is in private practice treating adults in psychoanalysis and psychodynamic psychotherapy. (The Hy Fingert MD Memorial Lecture was established in 2000 by Judith Fingert Chused, M.D., and Patricia Fingert to honor Hyman H. Fingert, M.D.)
