Drew Westen to speak at the Institute in February

Psychoanalytic researcher Drew Westen, Ph.D., will join academics and researchers for lunch and a discussion of "Cognitive Neuro-Science & Psychoanalysis" on Tuesday, February 22, followed by an evening presentation to the St. Louis Psychoanalytic Society on "Rethinking Transference: Implications of Developments in Cognitive Neuroscience." He will also speak at Washington University on "Emotional Constraint Satisfaction: Explaining Presidential Politics and Other Forms of Psychopathology" on Monday, February 21, 2005.

Drew Westen is Professor, Departments of Psychology and Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences, and Director of the Clinical Psychology Program, at Emory University. Dr. Westen is both a clinician and an active researcher who has written upwards of 100 scientific papers and two books, and currently holds grants from the National Institutes of Mental Health. His major areas of research are personality and personality disorders, unconscious processes, eating disorders, treatment effectiveness, adolescent psychopathology, political psychology, and the intersection of psychoanalysis and cognitive neuroscience. For several years he has been a commentator for All Things Considered on National Public Radio (NPR), and has performed as a stand-up comic.
